

Delhi Muslim Proposals 1927.

Separate electorates → hindrance in improving Hindu-Muslim Relations. Quaid-e-Azam proposed → if Hindus agreed to provide certain safeguards → Muslims would give up this demand.

→ the proposals were formally approved at a conference held by Muslims in 1927 at Delhi & are now called as "The Delhi Muslim Proposals."

Demands of Muslims:-

CSSPMS380

1. Muslim representation in Central Legislature would be less than one-third.
2. Hindu-minorities provinces would get same seats as Muslims would get in Hindu majority province.
3. Formation of separate province of Sindh.
4. Reforms in NWFP & Baluchistan.
5. Muslims would surrender → separate electorate until these proposals were implemented.
6. Communal matters → passed if three/4th members → agree.

Unfortunately, Congress first accepted & later rejected the proposals.
